radio, antenna, solar/battery/regulator/cables

$$1,250 + 450 + 2,200 = 3,900$$

radio, antenna, panels, batteries, cables

$$2,000 + 500 + 800 + 400 + 300 = 4,000$$

only a savings of \$100 per station, \$1,500 overall
